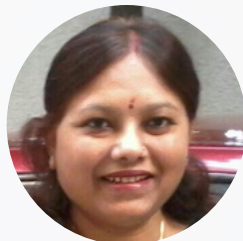

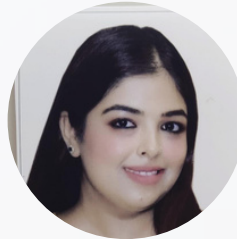

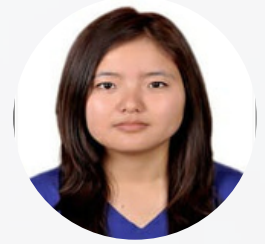

SAURABH JAIN

Mr. Saurabh Jain is the founder of Fun2Do Labs and StartupLearn.org. He was heading the 'Paytm-Build for India' program and had an active role in startup products, developer relations, and social impact/CSR within Paytm.

Mr. Jain is a Chartered Accountant and a member of the National Expert Advisory Committee (NEAC). He wrote India's first book on mobile app programming in 2003 - "Mobile Phone Programming."



BIJAY NAIR

LLt. Cdr. Bijay Nair is an Ex - Indian Naval Officer, a war veteran, an anchor, a poet, a blogger, an ultramarathoner, and a humorist who believes in imparting knowledge and wisdom.

In 2003 & 2004, he was commended by Flag Officer Western Naval Command, and in 2006 he received the prestigious Navy Chief of Staff Commendation. He is the author of the best-selling book :They Inspire.



ANIL SWARUP

Mr. Anil Swarup is the former Coal Secretary of India, former Education Secretary of India, ex-policeman, and an author.

He is known for his contributions to the coal ministry. A recipient of the Director's gold medal for "Best Officer Trainee" of his batch at LBSNAA, Mr. Swarup, has authored books like 'Not Just a Civil Servant' and 'Ethical Dilemmas of a Civil Servant'. Also, he is the founder of Nexus of Good, an organization that propagates and appreciates the good work that is being done in society as a whole.

DR. KIRAN BEDI

Kiran Bedi is a retired Indian Police Service officer, social activist, former tennis player, and politician who is the current Lieutenant Governor of Puducherry. She was the first woman to join the Indian Police Service (IPS) in 1972 and served for 35 years before taking voluntary retirement in 2007 as Director General, of the Bureau of Police Research and Development. In 2003, she became the first Indian woman to be appointed as a Police Advisor to the Secretary-General of the United Nations, in the Department of Peace Keeping Operations. On 22nd May 2016, she was appointed as the Lieutenant Governor of Puducherry.



PRAKASH AMTE
MADAKANI AMTE

Padma Shri Baba Prakash Amte is a social worker from Maharashtra.

In 2008, Prakash Amte and his wife, Mandakini Amte, received the Magsaysay Award for 'Community Leadership' for their philanthropic work with the Lok Biradari Prakalp. In November 2019, he was awarded the ICMR Lifetime Achievement Award by Bill Gates. In a world full of darkness, this duo proves to be the beam of hope and displays that there's no higher religion than human service.



CA ATUL GUPTA

C.A. Atul Kumar Gupta is serving on the Board of IFAC since November 2020. Nominated by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India, he is widely respected for his strong organizational skills and deep insight into the affairs of the profession.

He has vast experience in SMP Practice, specializing in Management Consultancy, Taxation especially GST, ITES, and Audit. During his association with the ICAI, he served as the President of ICAI (2020-21) and Vice President (2019-2020).

ARUSHI CHAWLA

Arushi Chawla, an actor, artist, dancer, model, and a Roadie at heart!

She is an influencer inspiring millions to be the best version of themselves. A firm believer in 'Loyalty is Royalty', she caught the public's eye for her remarkable participation in MTV Roadies Revolution (Season 18). She has represented her college in Scotland for dance, aced plenty of advertisements, and even founded a dance group - Artistic Athletes. Having a knack for martial arts, she is the one who stole everyone's hearts.



MANU BHAKER

She is the youngest Indian to win a gold medal at ISSF World Cup and an Indian Olympian who competes in airgun shooting. She represented India at the 2018 ISSF World Cup and won two gold medals.

She won the gold medal in the women's 10m air pistol event at the 2018 commonwealth games just at the age of 16 in her maiden commonwealth games appearance. When told to pick up dolls, picked up the gun instead, tied it up, and shot the target. She's indeed an inspiration for the youth of India.

COMMERCE BUZZ '22

A Step beyond Commerce

The second flagship event of Combrosia, Commerce Buzz, comes with immense amount of fun, joy and learning.

It is one of the largest undergraduate commerce festivals of University of Delhi that includes different astonishing events that requires your skills as well as intellectuality. Commerce Buzz'22 had ten different events that offered great amusement, enjoyment and entertainment.

After the pandemic and the lockdown, Commerce Buzz'22 was the first offline event organized by Combrosia. .

Following the tagline, 'experience the unexperienced', Combuzz'22 gave amazing experiences to the participants as well as the organizing team. The event was organized on 19th and 20th April 2022. The most intriguing part of the entire event was the cash prize, which attracted a great footfall of students.

From knowledge to entertainment and from intellectuality to having fun, Combuzz had it all. Through this, we covered the practicality of fun (from the games), learning (from the questions in various rounds) and excitement and exhilaration (from the prize money that was rewarded).

FILMISTAAN

Does a Bollywood dialogue strike a chord in your heart? Does your brain complete a dialogue before it is even said? Combrosia knew it already and brought the event, 'Filmistaan', for all its film-a-holic friends. No restrictions were made for the participants. Teams of 2 to 3 members were allowed to participate.

The event was subdivided into three rounds:

ROUND 1: Preliminary Round. This was a questionnaire round where more than 20 teams competed to reach the TOP 9.

ROUND 2: Promote an Object. In five minutes, each team had to advertise the object provided to them, and create a brand for it, a company, and a tagline, but with a twist. Each team was allotted a genre, using the maximum Bollywood inferences possible, and they were asked to advertise it for a maximum of 5 minutes.

ROUND 3: The Bidding Round. Teams were asked to bid for their favourite characters. The teams were supposed to use the characters and their genres from the last round to formulate a skit, play or simply narrate by changing/modifying/extending the story of how these characters ended up in their respective movies.



STOCKATHON

'Share Bazaar' is something our parents have always been skeptical of. Whereas, on the other side, various leading influencers keep on poking you to preach the 'POWER OF COMPOUNDING'. Well, Combrosia pierced right through this dilemma and organized Stockathon to give a taste of the stock market to the contestants. The event had 2 rounds.

ROUND 1: The Qualifier Round

More than 30 teams tried to reach the top 8 by filling out a questionnaire based on stocks.

ROUND 2: The Mock Stock Round

Here, in this round, the 'Time' was 'Money'.

6 Days - 8 minutes - 10L Capital (hypothetical) - and some great analyzing skills, these things were all that were required for this event.

This event definitely planted the next Rakesh Jhunjhunwala for Indian Stock Markets.



BRAND BAZAAR

A brand for a company is like a reputation for a person.

Brand Bazaar, as the name says, was all about commercials and brands and the stories behind them.

This event was conducted in four rounds. Teams of 2-3 members were allowed.

ROUND 1: THE QUESTIONNAIRE ROUND

This round was a world of questions, puzzles, jiggles, and much more about brands and advertisements.

ROUND 2: IDENTIFY THE AUDIO/ VIDEO

This round comprised various audios of commercials which you had to get right in order to go ahead.

ROUND 3: PICTURE WITH YOUR FAVOURITE BRAND

This round required participants to roam around and get themselves clicked with any brand found anywhere on the campus.

ROUND 4: ADVERTISE YOUR PRODUCT

Everyone was allotted a product that they had to advertise.



QUIZ - 'O' - DELLA

Quiz - O - Della, the name is enough for its explanation.

COMBROSIA organized one of its most insightful events in Commerce Buzz, where, knowledge, smart answers, and time played the most important role.

The competition consisted of 4 rounds, each being an eliminatory one. Teams of 2 or 3 members were allowed.

ROUND 1: Preliminary Round. Teams were given questionnaires to test their knowledge. Teams qualifying in this round went to the second round.

ROUND 2: Word Search Round. Teams were given questions based on which they were asked to look for answers in the given word search. Teams with most of the answers correct were sent forward to the next round.

ROUND 3: UNO Round Teams were given four power cards with which they had an advantage in answering the questions which were asked to them from the categories selected.

ROUND 4: Buzzer Round. This was the last and final round. This was played between two teams. The team with the most correct answers was declared the winner.

SNAP ON 4.0

This event consisted of three rounds:

ROUND 1:

ROUND 3:

The final round was to weave a story by capturing it in 3 pictures related to the theme given to them.

Combrosia made a platform available for all political enthusiasts to relish the hustle of their favorite parliamentary leaders.

The event had two rounds:

ROUND 1: The Qualifier Round

Participating teams had a tough competition to qualify for the next round.

ROUND 2: Mock Parliament

Right from the table bangs to supporting your party, this round had it all. The TOP 5 teams debated to draw out the best.



COMBROSIA CRICKET LEAGUE

Cricket is that religion which gets fans together like no other. To embrace this religion, CCL'22 was organized in Commerce Buzz'22.

The event consisted of three rounds played in teams of 2 to 4 players.

ROUND 1: THE QUESTIONNAIRE ROUND

This round examined the fascination of contestants for cricket by testing their facts through a questionnaire.

ROUND 2: THE QUIZ

The second round was the quiz round among the teams that qualified the first round.

ROUND 3: THE AUCTION ROUND

Cricket without an auction round sounds incomplete. So, the final round was the most fun and the intriguing round, the auction round, where, 8 teams, that qualified the second round, bid for their favorite players to form a team of 11 players.



MERGENTURE

Teams were required to prove how, by merging creatively and innovatively, a company can produce the top product in the market.

It was a 3-round event:

ROUND 1: Questionnaire Round

The questionnaire consisted of some basic questions to test the knowledge.

ROUND 2: This round was the auction and acquisition round of the companies.

ROUND 3: In this round, teams had to merge the companies and design a brand new innovative product.

Students from various universities gathered to participate in the event with great vigour and enthusiasm.



MUKADMA

Each team is comprised of two individuals. The event was divided into four rounds.

ROUND 3: Murder Mystery. In a mystery room filled with evidence, blood, and a corpse, they had to find the culprit. Two teams went ahead to Round 4.

ROUND 4: Mock Trial. A case was provided to both teams. The winner of Round 3 got an advantage to choose whether they wanted to be in favor or against the case. Both the teams acknowledged and brought the facts in front of the judges, and the team in favor of the case marked their victory.

Games, gifts, sashes and photos became the attraction of the event.

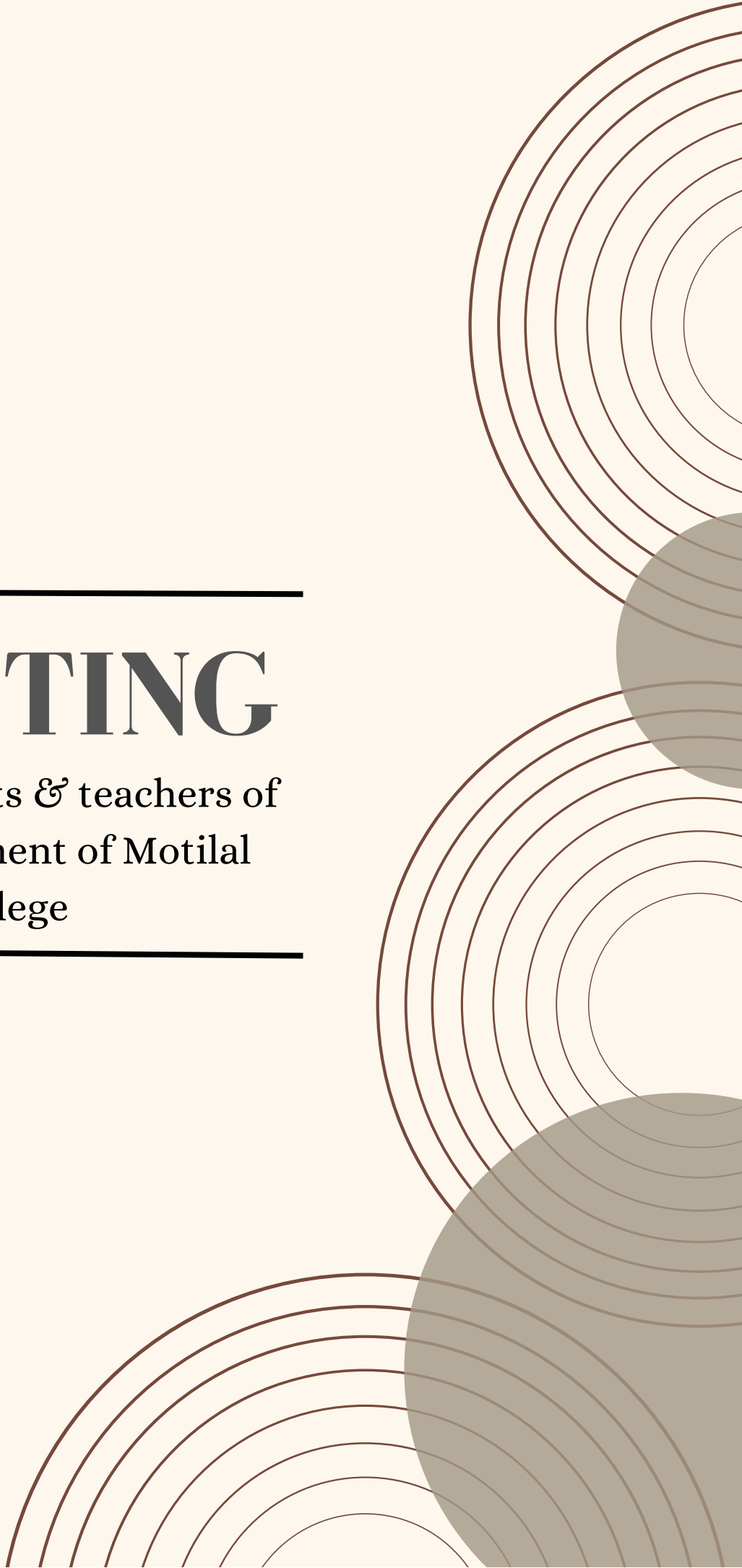
To end the perfect evening, the seniors shared their experiences and journeys with their juniors.

Cryptocurrency – Digital Gold or Digital Crude?

Satoshi Nakamoto introduced the world of cryptocurrency, particularly bitcoin globally in the year 2008. Over the period, people have assimilated to the working of crypto in their portfolios. Bitcoin has the largest market capitalisation (\$332.01B) followed by Ethereum (\$154.86B) and Tether (\$66.27B). The virtual currency having largest market capitalisation has for a long time worked on proof of work algorithm which requires immense energy consumption leading to release of anthropogenic gases. In the race of becoming developed and globalised, countries have shunned the expectations of passing a sustainable world to its successors.

Investors consider cryptocurrency as the safe-haven asset after gold which is a traditional asset. However, with increasing popularity of crypto among the investors, the crypto mining has also increased significantly. Increasing mining means rising hash rate which is a measure of the computational power on a blockchain network. Recently, in 2019, China has banned the crypto mining in the country after realising its harmful impact in the environment. Thus, the United States of America, Kazakhstan, Germany are few popular and major mining pools. On a different tangent, talking about the cryptocurrency market and market volatility, the digital currency is now so integrated with the world economy that the volatility spillovers have increases. Cryptocurrency is so connected with different asset classes like gold, equity market, foreign exchanges, crude oil market. Thus, it has been concluded that crypto is connected and influenced by the prices of other asset classes.

It is difficult to say that whether cryptocurrency provides benefit just like traditional commodity (gold) or gives undesirable by-product (carbon emissions) like that of crude oil. Crude oil is widely used in the countries to industrialise. Not to forget, crude oil is a non-renewable energy which emits large amount of carbon dioxide.
