THE MAKING OF MOTILAL NEHRU COLLEGE: MILESTONES IN HISTORY



- 1964: Established as Government College in a small school building at Moti Bagh, New Delhi, with 274 students and 10 teachers and offering B.A. (Prog.) & B.Com. (Hons)
- 1965: 1st Governing Body (GB) constituted; renamed as 'Degree College'
- 1967: Renamed as Hastinapur College by its first GB ➤ Mid-1970s: Started offering B.Sc. (Hons) Group-A and B.A.(Hons) courses; increased its faculty strength to 60 and student strength to 938
- 1977: Renamed after the illustrious figure of modern India, Motilal Nehru
- 1979: Foundation stone of a new building laid by Dr Neelam Sanjiva Reddy, the then President of India
- **1983:** Foundation stone of the administrative block laid by Professor Madhuri Shah, the then UGC Chairman
- 1986-87: grew in size with 1689 students, 95 teachers, 10 departments offering 12 courses
- 1989: shifted to its present location
- 2022: Recognized as a premier institution of higher education in south Delhi with 4500 students enrolled in 17 courses (14 undergraduate and 3 postgraduate), 142 faculty members in 11 departments, and over 100 administrative staff-members, and attracting students & teachers from all parts of the country and abroad.
- 2023: Permanent faculties in all the departments of the college have been appointed. ICT infrastructure of the college is upgraded with new computer systems.
- 2025: Foundation stone laid for a college auditorium with a seating capacity of 1000.

COLLEGE INFRASTRUCTURE & FACILITIES

Building Infrastructure

- Spacious, green campus spread over 9.87 acres
- State-of-the-art building with 45 classrooms spread in several blocks
- Well-stocked library with over one lakh books, a large number of periodicals/magazines, subscription-based e-resources, screen-reading software, a dedicated computer section for the visually challenged, and a Student Aid Fund or book bank from which deserving and needy students borrow books for a considerable period of time.
- Adequate facilities for sports: playground, cricket pitch, football uprights, volleyball and basketball courts, high-quality sports equipment, changing rooms, lockers, and one coach each for basketball and yoga.
- Room dedicated to practice/rehearse for cultural activities
- RO plant for purification of drinking water
- Rainwater harvesting system
- Girls' Common Room with attached washroom
- Medical room equipped to meet any medical emergency in the college and manned by a full-time experienced and qualified doctor
- Ramps and exclusive washrooms for differently-abled students
- Uninterrupted electricity and water supply
- Solar-powered Street lamps
- CCTV-enabled surveillance system throughout the campus
- Photocopy facilities
- Canteen with both indoor and outdoor seating arrangements and offering highquality and hygienically prepared foods/snacks and drinks at subsidized rates

IT Infrastructure

- Seven laboratories (in Physics, Chemistry, Computer Science and Mathematics Departments) and a 70-seater Seminar Room equipped with smart boards, ICT-enabled facilities and LCD projectors.
- Campus-wide Wi-Fi-connectivity with 12 access points
- Fully automated and IT-enabled library with three air-conditioned reading rooms
- Braille library, computers and facilities for reading, writing, scanning and printing for the visually impaired students

CHEMISTRY

The Department of Chemistry is one of the oldest (estd. 1964) departments in the college and one of the most prestigious and well-known chemistry departments across the university,. It has the distinction of eminent teaching faculty and modern research infrastructure. The department offers two courses, namely B.Sc. (Hons.) Chemistry and B.Sc. Physical Science with Chemistry. Alumni of the department have secured admission in premier post-graduate and research-based science and engineering institutions in India such TIFR, IISc, IITs, TERI, etc. and abroad. Apart from classroom teaching, faculty members are actively involved in research projects and have authored several books.

The department has three well-equipped laboratories along with an instrumentation laboratory that houses modern instruments, such as U.V.-Visible Spectrophotometer, Flame Photometers, Potentiometers, pH meters and colorimeters etc. **Quimica**, the Chemistry society, regularly organizes seminars, workshops and lecture series.







COMMERCE

The Department of Commerce, Motilal Nehru College continues to be the largest academic department, catering to a substantial number of students and committed to maintaining the highest standards of education with steadfast support to our students throughout their academic journey. In addition to providing comprehensive education in core subjects, our department has offered a range of Skill Enhancement and Value Added Courses to broaden the knowledge and skills of our students. These courses are designed to enhance their understanding and prepare them for a competitive and dynamic business environment. To foster a sense of belonging and encourage active participation, the department has established the Commerce Subject Society, which serves as a platform for students to engage in both academic and extracurricular activities. Additionally, we have Marketing Society under the department, aimed at deepening students' insights into marketing concepts and strategies.

Combrosia is a flourishing student-led association that is committed to enhancing the academic and extracurricular experience for all commerce students. With a focus on initiative, leadership, and teamwork, it organizes a variety of events - from student orientations and departmental activities to engaging seminars on topics such as financial literacy, taxation and emerging careers. The society provides a platform for its members to engage in Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) initiatives that allow them to create inclusive awareness.



COMPUTER SCIENCE

The department was established in 1985, at present it has three faculty members and two senior technical assistants, which caters to the students of B.Sc. Applied Physical Science. The departmental laboratory is equipped with fully functional 80 desktop systems, an overhead projector, two laser printers/scanners connected through a LAN system and an internet connection for maximum resource utilization. The Computer Science society, Techno Freaks, organizes seminars, workshops and lecture series. Many of the department's alumni have secured admission in post graduation courses in Computer Science in India and abroad, and are working in many multinational companies like NAGARO, NIC, IBM, Oracle, Google, TCS, Wipro, etc.





ECONOMICS

The Department of Economics is one of the oldest (estd. 1964) departments in the college, with a long tradition of imparting quality education in both theoretical and applied economics, extensive training opportunities and career guidance to its students. It offers a number of courses, viz. Wirschaft, the Economics society, organizes workshops, seminars, lectures and the annual festival Ecoverve.







ENGLISH

One of the oldest (estd. 1964) departments in the college, the Department of English offers courses that enable its students to learn, comprehend and critically evaluate literary works written or translated into English across a wide spectrum of genres. It offers a number of courses, viz. BA (Hons.) in English, English Discipline in B.A. (Multidisciplinary) course, Generic Elective (GE) courses, Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), and Value-Added Course (VAC). The department also has an exciting extra-curricular calendar marked by interactive sessions with notable literateurs, webinars/seminars, creative writing competitions, and the annual literature festival, LitCelebrate. With an array of competitions, this is the occasion for you to either organize or participate literature-themed competitions. The English Department has an Instagram handle, @englishdept.mlnc, that is run by its students... The students also showcase their creative writing and editorial skills through the annual literary magazine *Logos*.



ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES

The Department of Environment Studies teaches a compulsory course (AEC) of Environment Science to the students of arts, commerce and sciences. The department engages with the students through innovative pedagogical methods, e.g., field-trips, hands-on activities, seminars, workshops, movie-screenings and lectures by experts.



HINDI

मोतीलाल नेहरू कॉलेज का हिन्दी विभाग दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालयों के विभिन्न महाविद्यालय के हिन्दी विभागो में से एक सर्वश्रेष्ठ विभाग है। हिन्दी विभाग में कार्यरत्त सभी शिक्षक विषय विशेषज्ञ होने के साथ साथ विद्यार्थियों के विकास के लिए समर्पित है। मोतीलाल नेहरु कॉलेज का हिन्दी विभाग पाठ्यक्रम प्रशिक्षण के साथ छात्रो के सांस्कृतिक सामाजिक और बौद्धिक विकास के लिए प्रतिबद्ध है। साहित्य,सिनेमा रंगमंच और मीडिया पढ़ाने का तरीका सैद्धांतिक होने के साथ प्रायोगिक भी है। इसका मूल कारण रहा है कि पाठ्यक्रम का अध्यापन केवल विद्यार्थियों को तोता बनाना नहीं बल्कि उनको व्यवहारिक बनाने के साथ संवेदनशील बनाना भी है। नई शिक्षा नीति - 2020 के अंतर्गत पढ़ाए जाने वाले विषय जैसे AEC, SEC और VAC के प्रश्न पत्रों खासकर प्रथम वर्ष के विद्यार्थियों के लिए विशेष प्रशिक्षण भी दिया जाता है। अंतिम वर्ष के छात्रों के लिए विकल्प के रूप में व्यावसायिक विषयों की चयन की सुविधा है।



HISTORY

The Department of History is one of the oldest (estd. 1964) departments in the college, and offers a number of courses, viz. BA (Hons.) in History, History Discipline in B.A. (Multidisciplinary) course, Generic Elective (GE) courses, Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) and Value-Added Course (VAC). Ateet, the History society, organizes a wide range of academic and extracurricular activities: seminars, lectures/talks, screenings of movies and documentaries on historical themes, annual educational trips to historic places in and outside Delhi. Every year, in order to encourage academic excellence among students, the department awards two scholarships— the Shanti Devi Jain Merit Scholarship and the S. P. Jain Merit Scholarship instituted (2010-11) by Dr. V. K. Jain, a former faculty member, in the memory of his parents—to two students of the first and second year who secured the first and second ranks in the university examination.







MATHEMATICS

One of the oldest (estd. 1964) departments in the college, the Department of Mathematics has experienced and committed teachers specializing in a wide array of research areas in pure and applied mathematics. The department provides ample resources, extensive training opportunities and guidance to channelize the bright young minds towards the pursuit of mathematics as a passion and a career. Besides B.Sc. (Hons.) in Mathematics, the department offers papers in Mathematics as part of the B.Sc. course in Physical Science with Chemistry/ Computer Science, and the B.A. (Multidisciplinary) course, as well as interdisciplinary Generic Elective (GE) courses. Through its state-of-the-art Mathematics Computer Laboratory, the department provides practical training in -Wolfram Mathematica, C++, Statistical Software R, Latex, and TORA. Dimension, the Mathematics society, strives to further mathematical studies by organizing seminars, workshops, festivals, educational tours and much more.







PHYSICAL EDUCATION

A dedicated physical education department has been there since the college was established in 1964. The department works for the overall development of the students. This year the department developed a synthetic basketball court with a seating capacity of 100 to inaugurate which it conducted the Delhi University inter-college basketball competition. the physical education department also has an open area badminton facility.



PHYSICS

The Department of Physics is one of the oldest (estd. 1964) and largest departments in college. It is located in the Science block of the college. The faculty members are actively engaged in imparting both theoretical and practical knowledge of the subject in order to prepare students for research, academics and industry. The department offers B.Sc. (Hons.) in Physics and B.Sc. Physical Science and B. Sc. Applied Physical Science, as well as various interdisciplinary Generic Elective (GE) courses. The department has three state-of-the-art laboratories, viz. Physics Lab 1, Physics Lab 2 and Computational Lab.—all well-equipped with modern instruments and old unique apparatuses. The Computational Lab. provides practical training to students in C/C++, Sci lab, MATLAB, Python, etc. Anushandhan, the Physics society, regularly organizes seminars, workshops and lecture series that enable the students to learn from and interact with experts in various fields. It also publishes its annual magazine, Quanta, that provides a forum for the students to showcase their writing skills. The department established a partnership with IIRS, making the college a nodal center for ISRO's online learning programs. Students and faculty can now enroll in interactive courses, enhancing remote sensing and space science education.As part of National Science Day, students toured IUAC's accelerator and experimental facilities and attended a keynote lecture by Prof. Bedangadas Mohanty on the origin of mass in fundamental particles.



POLITICAL SCIENCE

The The Department of Political Science at Motilal Nehru College is a vibrant department. It prides itself on the pursuit of academic excellence along with a strong focus on co-curricular activities. The Department has an exceptional set of faculty members. The teaching -learning process is made engaging through innovative pedagogy and a strong focus on research. The Department also offers an Add-on course on Research Methodology to cultivate analytical skills and train students for pursuit of their chosen careers. The Department subject society, 'Nitigya' organises talks, seminars and an annual festival enabling students to learn, participate and connect. The Department also has a strong alumni network which can be leveraged by students for support and guidance.





SANSKRIT

संस्कृत-विभाग मोतीलाल नेहरू महाविद्यालय , दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय का एक अत्यन्त महत्त्वपूर्ण अंग है। यहाँ स्नातक स्तर पर बी.ए. ऑनर्स एवं बी.ए. प्रोग्राम का अध्यापन होता है। विभाग की स्थापना सन् १९६५ ईस्वी में की गयी। सर्वप्रथम डॉ. जे.डी. दीक्षित जी के मार्गदर्शन में बी.ए. प्रोग्राम का पाठ्यक्रम आरम्भ किया गया। तत्पश्चात् सन् १९८७ ईस्वी में बी.ए. ऑनर्स का पाठ्यक्रम प्रारम्भ किया गया। विभाग के निर्माण एवं सुव्यवस्थित रूप से संचालित करने में अनेक आचार्यों का योगदान रहा है, उनमें से कुछ उल्लेखनीय नाम है- प्रो बलदेव राज शर्मा , प्रो. रमेश चन्द्र भारद्वाज , स्वर्गीय डॉ. रमण शर्मा , स्वर्गीय डॉ. जे.पी. मिश्रा , प्रो. श्री वत्स, डॉ. कौशल्या । इनमें से डॉ. जे.पी. मिश्रातथा प्रो. श्री वत्स ने कुछ समय तक महाविद्यालय के प्राचार्य पद को अलंकृत किया। प्रो. रमेश चन्द्र भारद्वाज लंबे समय तक संस्कृत- विभाग , दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय के अध्यक्ष पद को सुशोभित किया। प्रो.भारद्वाज ने महर्षि वाल्मीकि संस्कृत विश्वविद्यालय , कैथल में कुलपति के पद को भी अलंकृत किया।

विभाग द्वारा संचालित अथर्वा संस्कृत-परिषद् विद्यार्थियों के सर्वांगीण विकास हेतु प्रतिवर्ष संस्कृत वाङ्मय से सम्बन्धित व्याख्यान , संकृत- सम्भाषण शिविर , अन्तर्महाविद्यालयीय प्रतियोगिताओं तथा अनेक रचनात्मक गतिविधियों का आयोजन एवं संचालन करती है। उपर्युक्त कार्यक्रमों के माध्यम से विद्यार्थियों को अपने भावाभिव्यक्ति का उचित मञ्च प्राप्त होता है तथा अनेक सुप्रसिद्ध विद्वानों का सानिध्य भी मिलता है ।

LIFE ON CAMPUS

Our college has a vibrant campus life with year-round academic and extra-curricular activities carried out by students under various societies. All these societies regularly organize lectures/talks, symposia, conferences/seminars, workshops, panel-discussions, and a wide range of intra- and inter-college competitive events, as also participate and win prizes in such events outside the college. The societies thus provide ample opportunities and diverse platforms to the students to cultivate and showcase their talent and creativity in different areas. The college provides adequate facilities, funds and required equipment to the societies and has a well-equipped cultural room for the students to practice for the cultural events. All societies work under the active supervision of teachers.





SOCIETIES OF CULTURE COMMITTEE

The Cultural Committee of the college is comprised of seven sub-committees or societies effectively managed by elected student bodies. Any student of the college can become a member of any society if s/he demonstrates his/her keen interest and adequate potential in the area under its purview, e.g., drama, music, dance, debate, etc. The societies are as follows:

1. Aadhaar, the theater society, performs both stage- and street-plays for raising public awareness on a range of topical issues, and provides talented students a platform for honing and exhibiting their skills in acting, music, script- and dialogue-writing, and direction.

2. Malhaar, the music society, is divided into three wings, viz. the Indian Classical wing, the Western wing, and the band. It provides a forum for gifted students to showcase their talent in vocal and instrumental music.

3. Electra, the Western dance society, one of the best such societies in the University circuit, is a team of enthusiastic dancers who practice and perform various genres of Western dance on various fora.
4. Bellissimo, the fashion society, actively encourages its members to use their creativity and aesthetic sense to design garments and ensemble outfits and showcase them in the inter-college festivals and fashion shows in Delhi as well as outside.

5. Jhankaar, the folk-dance society, encourages all traditional Indian dance forms and thereby continually celebrates the rich, pluralistic culture of the country through its diverse performing arts.

6. Chhayankan, the film and photography society, strives to encourage students to tell thoughtprovoking and impactful stories through photography and film-making. It also regularly screens films of diverse genres, languages and countries, documentaries and photography exhibitions, accompanied by intense formal and informal discussions. Further, it conducts workshops on filmmaking, and organizes 'Meet-the-Director' events.

7. Abhivyanjana fosters the freedom of creative expression as well as verbal and literary skills among the students through participation in bilingual debates, poetry-writing and creative-writing.

The Committee annually organizes a grand cultural festival 'Kaafila' that attracts students not only from Delhi University but from different universities across the country. The festivities include competitive events in dramatics, music, dance, fashion and photography, and cultural events such as performances by leading artists and renowned rock bands.

Fine Arts Society (Kriti Rang)

The Fine Arts Society encourages students to explore their creative potential in fields such as photography, mural art, sculpture, painting, and sketching. It also organizes an annual inter-college fine arts festival.



Women Development Cell

The Women's Development Cell (WDC) at Motilal Nehru College is a vibrant hub of empowerment, driving gender equality through transformative initiatives. We foster self-worth, safe spaces, and inclusivity, creating a "home away from home" for all. Our dynamic sessions explore feminism—its history, myths, and narratives—while dissecting patriarchy's impact on female literacy and work-life balance across sectors. Through intersectional dialogues, workshops, and collaborations with activists and NGOs, we challenge stereotypes and amplify marginalized voices. Whether raising awareness,

celebrating diversity, or advocating for justice, WDC bridges theory and action, shaping a campus culture rooted in respect and equity. We build a space where equality isn't just a deal—it's reality. Together, we rise, resist, and redefine. Bebakh'25: The annual fest celebrated resilience and solidarity with a dynamic lineup, including an opening ceremony, renowned speaker sessions, and the launch of the ASTITV A magazine. Attendees explored interactive stalls, witnessed a powerful flash mob, and engaged n a panel discussion on beauty standards. Highlights included a period pain simulator, Nukkad Natak, and student competitions. The fest concluded with a memorable closing.







North-East Students' Cell

The North-East Students Cell is mentored by a faculty member functioning as a university-mandated Nodal Officer and aims to promote among the student's greater awareness and appreciation of the cultures in the north-eastern region of India. In doing so, it seeks to sensitize them to cultural differences and instill in them a sense of pride in the enormous cultural diversity of the Indian subcontinent. It organizes an inter-college North East Cultural Day in order to provide the students of the region opportunities to showcase their traditional songs, dances, attires, cuisine, and other cultural practices.



National Social Service (NSS) and National Cadet Corps (NCC)

The National Service Scheme (NSS) and National Cadet Corps (NCC) are committed to a wide range of programmes and activities that among the students inculcate a strong sense of civic responsibility and a spirit of service to the country and society.

The NCC, which has both boys' and girls' wings, helps the cadets develop confidence, discipline and team spirit. The cadets routinely participate in institutional training, Republic Day parades, youth exchange programs, adventure camps and community outreach programmes. Such activities not only provide them with an advantage in various employment opportunities, but also help them learn life skills and develop a well-rounded persona. The registered members of NCC have to appear for 'B' & 'C' Certificate exams conducted by the NCC wing of Delhi.

The student-volunteers of NSS organizes such community outreach programmes as blood donation camps, campus cleaning drives, sapling plantation drives, educating slum children, and awareness campaigns on many topical social and environmental issues. The student-members also extend services during times of natural calamities and disasters by way of organizing donation drives.



Enactus

Enactus, an international non-profit non-governmental organization present in 1,700 Universities across 36 countries, has over 70,000 active student-members who take up social outreach projects for the benefit of underprivileged communities: they identify such communities, devise self-sustaining business models for them, and help their members become entrepreneurs.

The Enactus team in our college provides a platform for students to embark on exemplary community outreach, social entrepreneurship and awareness-building activities throughout the year. It has helped increase the students' sensitivity towards social and environmental causes by regularly undertaking innovative projects such as feeding, vaccination, sterilization and protection of neighborhood dogs; sapling-plantation; cleanliness, sanitation and personal hygiene; and donation of food and clothes in slums. Recently, it designed a utility and a product for which we have approached the Government of India for patenting, keeping in view their uniqueness. The college will bear all expenses incurred on patenting these products. Over the years, the Enactus has gathered accolades from institutions in India and abroad for its innovative social entrepreneurship projects. Most notably, it received the Genpact Campus Impact Award from TERI and Genpact in 2016; mentorship from KPMG in 2020; and a seed grant of USD 1000 from The Pollination Project (TPP), a US-based organization, for its project 'DESI' for sterilization and vaccination of stray dogs in 2020.





CDF—MLNC

Connecting Dreams foundation (CDF) is a non-profit organization which provides the youth with an opportunity to empower underprivileged people through entrepreneurial action and social work and thereby improve their lives and livelihoods and help them achieve their dreams. The CDF Chapter in Motilal Nehru College aims to bring about a transformative impact on the lives of people in need. Currently, it is working on three projects, namely (a)Project Jazbaat, an effort to promote a more positive and proactive approach to addressing mental illnesses; (b) Project Udyam, an initiative in upskilling poor women and helping them gain financial independence; and (c) Project Dream Library, an attempt to provide quality education and valuable lessons to underprivileged children.



Students' Union

The Students' Union is the premier elected student body that represents the interests of all the students of the college and plays an integral part in the decision-making process of the institution. Its membership is compulsory for all students of the college. It aims to cultivate leadership, organizational and team skills; art of self-expression through public speaking and public interaction; and a capacity for collective decision-making and participatory management among the students. It also promotes intellectual and cultural development of its members and endeavors to give them training in the functioning of democratic institutions. The Students' Union Advisory Committee (SUAC) mentors and supervises the functioning of the union, and actively interacts with the elected student office-bearers. Some of the union members have become leading figures in the socio-political life of the country.





Placement Cell

The Placement Cell plays an important role in helping deserving and meritorious students get jobs and internships in the industry, thereby facilitating the launch of their careers. The student representatives of the cell systematically work towards establishing networks and linkages with corporate agencies/ houses and engaging them for placement/recruitment drives in the college. The cell also provides dedicated career guidance by apprising the students of the current market scenario, employability in different fields and the requisite skillsets. To this end, it organizes workshops on employability and developing interview skills. The cell has had a good record of helping students in finding internships and final placements in leading companies and organizations.





College Magazine

The college annually publishes 'Navagat' a trilingual magazine–in Hindi, Sanskrit and English. It brings out reviews of educational, cultural, social and sports activities of the college and articles by the students and staff. It is edited by an editorial boarrd comprised of teachers and students. It is an ideal platform for students to exhibit their creative writing skills.

Dr. Ambedkar Study Circle, Gandhi Study Circle and National Seminar Committee

The Dr. Ambedkar Study Circle and the Gandhi Study Circle hold talks/lectures, conferences/seminars, panel discussions, film-screenings and competitive events, especially on the birth and death anniversaries of Dr. Ambedkar and Mahatma Gandhi, and often in collaboration with premier research organizations such as the Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICCSR), the Nehru Memorial Museum & Library (NMML) and the Indian Council for Historical Research (ICHR). These activities are aimed at celebrating and commemorating the two larger-than-life figures of modern India, and exploring the complexities and nuances of their thoughts, ideas and practices, as well as their relevance in today's world. Besides the departmental subject societies, the National Seminar Committee steers the academic activities at the college level, including the prestigious annual Motilal Nehru Lecture Series on the foundation day of the college. Under this series, talks have been delivered by eminent public figures such as Ms. Shaknuntala Devi (mathematician), Dr. Karan Singh (politician and philosopher), Mr. L. M. Singhvi (jurist, parliamentarian, scholar and diplomat), Professor Irfan Habib (historian), Acharya Hazari Prasad Dwivedi (Hindi novelist, literary historian, essayist, critic and scholar), Mr. Harivanshrai Bachchan (Hindi poet), Professor Ashok Vajpai (Hindi poet, essayist, literary-cultural critic), Ms. Kavita Krishnan (women's rights activist), Ms. Indira Jaising (lawyer and Human Rights activist) and Professor Shekhar Pathak (environmentalist).



Sports

The Department of Physical Education provides opportunities for students to train for and participate, as individuals and as teams, in intra- and inter-college, university, inter-university, state, national and international competitive events. The college has facilities for sports such as football, basketball, volleyball, cricket, athletics, wrestling, boxing, power-lifting, etc. An intra-college Sports Day is held every year in which students from the college, as well as members of teaching and non-teaching staff, get an opportunity to showcase their sporting abilities in competitive team events. Many of our students have won laurels at university, national and international levels. Recently, Praveen Kumar made our college proud by winning the silver medal in the men's high jump T64 event of the Tokyo Paralympics 2020.
