

STOP FOR A MOMENT. BEFORE YOU RUSH TO YOUR 08:30 AM LECTURE, LOOK AT THE GROUND BENEATH YOUR FEET. WHILE THE FEBRUARY WINDS SWEEP ACROSS DELHI, THE VIBRANT CORRIDORS OF MOTILAL NEHRU COLLEGE (MLNC) TELL A STORY OF GRIT AND VISION THAT REDEFINED THE UNIVERSITY OF DELHI.

FOR THE MLNC FAMILY, MID-FEBRUARY ISN'T JUST ANOTHER DATE ON THE CALENDAR. IT IS OUR 'STHAPANA DIVAS' : THE ANNIVERSARY OF A DAY THAT CHANGED OUR DESTINY. IF YOU THINK THIS MAJESTIC 10-ACRE POWERHOUSE ON BENITO JUAREZ MARG APPEARED OVERNIGHT, YOU'RE MISSING THE MOST DRAMATIC CHAPTERS OF OUR SAGA. THIS IS A STORY OF A "NOMAD" INSTITUTION THAT FOUGHT FOR ITS IDENTITY AND FINALLY BUILT AN EMPIRE.



JANUARY 10, 1977 : THE BIRTH OF A TITAN

BEFORE WE WERE A SOUTH CAMPUS POWERHOUSE, WE WERE AN INSTITUTION IN SEARCH OF A SOUL. ESTABLISHED IN 1964 AS A HUMBLE GOVERNMENT

PROJECT, THE COLLEGE ORIGINALLY OPERATED AS 'HASTINAPUR COLLEGE'. IT WAS A RESPECTED NAME, BUT IT LACKED THE WEIGHT OF THE FUTURE WE WERE BUILDING.



ON JANUARY 10, 1977, THE ULTIMATE TRANSFORMATION OCCURRED. WE DIDN'T JUST CHANGE A SIGNBOARD; WE ADOPTED A LEGACY. BY RENAMING THE INSTITUTION AFTER PANDIT MOTILAL NEHRU, THE CELEBRATED LEGAL LUMINARY AND FREEDOM FIGHTER. WE SIGNALLED TO THE UNIVERSITY THAT WE WERE NO LONGER A TEMPORARY SETUP. WE WERE NOW AN INSTITUTION DESTINED FOR INTELLECTUAL AND CULTURAL GREATNESS.

FEBRUARY 14, 1979: A PRESIDENTIAL PROCLAMATION

THE REAL "TURNING POINT" IN OUR HISTORY WAS ETCHED INTO THE EARTH ON FEBRUARY 14, 1979 . ON THIS DAY, THE HIGHEST OFFICE IN THE LAND MOVED TOWARD BENITO JUAREZ MARG. WITH THE STRIKE OF A MALLET, THE PRESIDENT OF INDIA, DR. NEELAM SANJIVA REDDY, LAID THE FOUNDATION STONE OF OUR CURRENT CAMPUS.
