Our college conducts various academic and extra-academic activities through its Departmental Subject-Societies and Committees of staff council. In addition we have increased electric substation capacity from 300 KV to 500 KV which has been inaugurated by Honorable Deputy Chief Minister today itself. We have also increased the Library space by extending it to the corridor outside the Library. We further propose to build a reading room on the first floor above the library.

Last but not the least we are collectively putting efforts to make this institution excel in all areas to make our students benefited and society at large. I sincerely thank our chief guest Honorable Shri Manish Sisodiya Ji, Guest of Honor, Sh. Khemchand Jagirdar and distinguished guest Sh. There are 14 dogs within the college campus who are all sterilized and vaccinated (anti-rabies). They all have names and they are fed once every day. They are also provided with medical aid whenever they are sick or injured. The dogs lead a healthy and a happy life. The various programmes and events of Enactus MLNC in 2015-16 are listed below:

1. Through Awareness Campaigns students created awareness about the rules and guidelines laid down by the Animal Welfare Board of India regarding stray dogs both within the college and outside the college.

2. Two dog shelters (feeding zones) were built for dog feeding in the college campus (one in the front and one at the back)

3. Students collaborated with PAWS and Jaagruti (NGOs) for giving medical aid and assistance to the injured and sick dogs of the college

4. Students are helping poor women of Sanjay Gandhi Centre a slum dwelling in Chanakyapuri, New Delhi by providing them a means of livelihood. The women are being taught to make dog collars and dog cookies which are sold in the market by the name of Be Desi Products. The profit from the sale goes to the women and the NGOs who work for animal welfare

5. Students have tied up with pet shops (retail outlets) to sell BeDesi Products

6. The Enactus India Young Leaders blog started a new segment called spotlight which got launched on 15th Jan 2016 with a write-up on Project Parivartan (MLNC). Motilal Nehru College was the first college amongst hundreds of colleges affiliated to Enactus India to be showcased in the blog

7. The students have got selected in the first round of Campus Impact Challenge competition organised by TERI in collaboration with Genpact. Under the competition the students are working on the 'Be Desi Adopt a Desi' Campaign which is for a period of six months duration (Jan-June 2016). This is a campaign for creating awareness about stray dogs in India.
