#### The Subject Society, Department of History, 2023-24

#### Convener: Dr. Kalpana Malik (Associate Professor)

- The Department of History organised an Orientation Programme for the new students at the beginning of the academic session 2023-24 on 16<sup>th</sup> August 2023.
- The Department conducted elections to the student executive posts for 3/teet: The History Society and 3/mānat: The Heritage Club on 9th October 2023.
- Hmānat: The Heritage Club held a workshop on 'Heritage Workshop and Volunteerism for Colleges' on 19th October 2023, in collaboration with Indian National Trust for Art and Cultural Heritage (INTACH). Ms. Purnima Datt, Principal Director, Heritage Education and Communication Service (HECS), INTACH, was the lead speaker and was accompanied by Ms. Nanki Kaur and Ms. Swati Deora, program coordinators of HECS.
- Steet organised the Freshers' welcome on 31st October 2023.
- The Department held a two-day National Seminar on 'Gender in Indian History: Constructions, Representations and Reality' on 23rd–24th November 2023, sponsored by Indian Council of Historical Research (ICHR). The seminar, initially scheduled to be held on 24th and 25th March 2020 with the grant approved by the ICHR in December 2019, could not be held from 2020 to 2022 due to the outbreak of Covid-19 pandemic and consequent multi-phase lock-downs. However, when finally held in 2023 upon the return of normalcy, the seminar turned out to be hugely successful, retaining most of the resource persons and paper-presenters as listed in the original schedule, as well as the support of ICHR. Its seven sessions over two days had stimulating lectures and paper-presentations by eminent academicians, faculty and research scholars from premier universities such as the University of Delhi, Jawaharlal Nehru University, Jamia Millia Islamia, and Jai Narain Vyas University (Jodhpur). The seminar drew enthusiastic response and participation from the faculty and students alike.
- Imanat organised a visit to the National Archives of India (NAI) for the faculty and students of B.A. (Hons.) History on 14th December 2023. The students visited the various sections of the archives, and received first-hand information about the history of NIA; about rare old manuscripts, maps, books, reports and other documents; and about the techniques of preservation and cataloguing from the concerned personnel.
- Imanat held an orientation session with the students of B.A. (Hons.) History on 1st February 2024, in order to sensitise them about the various types of tangible and intangible heritage around us and the ways to conserve it.



- Six students of the Department, accompanied by Dr Kalpana Malik, attended the Youth Volunteer Training Workshop on 24th January 2024, organised by Heritage Education and Communication Service (HECS) of Indian National Trust for Art and Cultural Heritage (INTACH). The workshop was designed to sensitise the youth to protect their heritage and train them to become pioneers in leading a nation-wide movement for heritage conservation and preservation.

#### Annual Report of the National Seminar Committee, 2023-24

#### Convener - Dr. Kalpana Malik

The National Seminar Committee, in collaboration with the Department of History, held an International Seminar on 'Traversing the Land of Tales: Storytelling Traditions in Indian Culture' on 9th-10th April 2024. Planned and organised in less than a month with a generous grant amounting to rupees two lakhs, approved by the Indian Council of Historical Research (ICHR), it was the first time that an International Seminar was organised by the National Seminar Committee with the financial assistance availed from a government organisation. Following the guidelines laid out by the New Education Policy (NEP) 2020, great efforts were made to make the Seminar as interdisciplinary as possible. The seminar brought together Indian and foreign scholars from the disciplines of history, archaeology, political science, classical and modern Indian languages (such as Persian, Sanskrit, English and Hindi) The seminar began with inaugural remarks by Principal Prof. Yogeshwar Sharma, welcome address by Convener Dr. Kalpana Malik; lectures by Chief Guest Prof. B.K. Shrivastava of Dr. Harisingh Gour University, Sagar, MP, and Guest of Honor Dr. Om Jee Upadhyay, Member-Secretary (officiating), ICHR; and keynote address by renowned archaeologist Prof. Vasant Shinde. Among the chief speakers, Prof. Eugenia Vanina (Russian Academy of Sciences, Moscow) spoke on the function of mediaeval biographies as both stories and histories; Prof. Lavanya Vemsani (Shawnee State University, Ohio, US), on the representations of lord Narasimha in the texts, folklore, art of central India; Prof. Raziuddin Aquil (Delhi University), on stories of miracles and other anecdotes in Medieval Indian Sufi Literature; Prof. Om Nath Bimali, Head of the Sanskrit Department (Delhi University), on the akhyana genre in Sanskrit literary tradition; Prof. Chander Shekhar (Delhi University), on the Persian versions of Indian stories in illustrated manuscripts; Prof. Vijava Laxmi Singh (Delhi University), on the ancient visual and textual representations of Buddhist stories; Prof. S.P. Vyas, (Secretary Rajasthan History Congress, J.N.V. University, Jodhpur), Prof. Manorama Upadhyaya (Treasurer Rajasthan History Congress, Principal Mahila P.G. Mahavidyalaya, Jodhpur) and Prof. S.I.A. Zaidi (Jamia Millia Islamia), on different narrative genres of Rajasthan; Dr. Bhuwan Jha (Delhi University), on the ingenious use of tales from Hindu scriptures by Pt. Madan Mohan Malviya in his sermons to the youth; Prof. Smita Sahgal (Delhi University), on the tales of forest-dwelling nishadas in the Mahabharata; Prof. Ramesh Sharma, renowned Hindi litterateur, on stories in folk literature and folk culture; Dr. G.S. Meena (Jawaharlal Nehru University), on tribal folktales; Prof. Pawan Sinha, on the use of storytelling in history class; and Dr. Jagriti Upadhyaya (Sardar Patel University of Police, Security and Criminal Justice, Jodhpur), on the idea of niti in the Panchatantra. Besides, a number of research scholars and facultymembers from universities in the city presented their papers on aspects of diverse storytelling traditions across time. The seminar concluded with a narrative performance by students and vote of thanks by Prof. R.C. Meena, member National Seminar Committee.
