11. Significant contributions made by IQAC during the current year (maximum five bullets)

The institution under the aegis of IQAC implemented the University of Delhi's Undergraduate Curriculum Framework (UGCF)-2022 under New Education Policy (NEP)-2020, and the admission process based on Common University Entrance Test (CUET).

The IQAC screened all the applications for promotion as received and initiated the process of regular appointment to teaching positions. Three faculty-members were promoted in the period 2022-23.

The IQAC took several initiatives towards imparting skill-training to students: (a) The Committee for Skill Development and Entrepreneurship was constituted in April 2023, and students duly selected through an interview process were made its members alongside the faculty-members. (b) A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed with the Korean Cultural Centre-India (KCCI) on 23/01/2023 for the introduction of skill-based programs/courses. (c) A 12-week course in Korean language (04/02/2023-22/04/2023) in collaboration with KCCI was successfully conducted for a batch of 35 students.

Several academic programmes were conducted under the aegis of IQAC. These included an international seminar on Indian Knowledge Systems (IKS); seminars/lectures on various themes related to academic

disciplines taught by different departments; orientation programme for the first batch of students admitted under UGCF-2022 through CUET; and career counseling sessions for students.

15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

- (a) The institution believes in providing affordable, quality higher education, and an enabling and empowering learning environment to the youth from all sections of society. It envisions playing an impactful role in the lives of its students, not only by helping them acquire the requisite knowledge and skillsets to excel academically and professionally, but also by motivating them to become conscientious and responsible citizens committed to the betterment of society. In doing so, it visualizes them as becoming capable of synthesizing their learning with societal needs, and of taking the initiative and lead in making the society more democratic and equitable for all sections. The institution also sees itself as an incubator of academic freedom and excellence, as well as creativity and originality of thoughts. It aims to foster a spirit of socio-cultural inclusivity and harmony among students from diverse socio-economic, regional, linguistic and cultural backgrounds, and make them able contributors to nation-building.
- (b) Integration of humanities and sciences with STEM has been made possible by the UGCF-2022 under NEP-2020. The wide range of Skill Enhancement (SEC) and Value Addition (VAC) courses from humanities and sciences available to students from all streams allows them to understand and appreciate the need for developing scientific temper, technical skills, social and political awareness, ethical values, creative mind, taste for arts and literature, and other important life skills, in order to lead a balanced fulfilling life and have a broad worldview. The various departments for sciences and humanities, thus, offer common courses that aim to inculcate these qualities among the students. These courses are as follows:

- (c) The institution offers to all students admitted under the NEP-UGCF-2022 certain credit-based VAC and SEC courses that promote environmental education, life skills and community engagement, e.g. 'Swachh Bharat'; 'Prospecting e-Waste & Sustainability'; 'Life Skill Education'; 'Ethics and Culture'; 'Ethics and Values in Ancient Indian Tradition'; and 'Ecology and Literature'. The Department of Environment Studies teaches Environment Science as Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC) to the students of all streams. It engages with the students through innovative pedagogical methods aimed at raising environmental consciousness, e.g. field-trips, hands-on activities, seminars, workshops, movie-screenings and lectures by experts.

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- (d) The institution has already implemented the University of Delhi's UGCF-2022 and the ABC scheme which provide a multidisciplinary flexible curriculum and multiple entry- and exit-points.
- (e) The institution encourages its faculty-members to apply for research projects funded by governmental and non-governmental agencies on topical areas such as social equity (especially gender equity) of access to public goods; public education, health and sanitation; eco-sustainable approaches to urban lifestyles; energy-efficient technologies; informed and responsible civic behavior, etc. The institution plans to incentivize the faculty-members taking up such projects by providing them all the resources and facilities that they may require and that the institution can afford to provide.
- (f) Under the UGCF-2022, the institution offers multiple SEC and VAC courses that go beyond the conventional disciplinary compartmentalization and provide the students from different steams with a holistic interdisciplinary education in technical skills, soft skills, ethical values, balanced and healthy living, traditional knowledge systems and cultural practices.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

- (a) University of Delhi's UGCF-2022 adheres to the scheme for earning and accumulation of credits in the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC), introduced under the New Education Policy (NEP), 2020. In view of the diverse socio-economic and educational backgrounds and the differential degrees of opportunities and competencies that the students have, the scheme allows the student to exit and re- enter the institution at certain stages of an undergraduate programme/course in order to accommodate their requirements and facilitate the completion of their studies depending upon their priorities of life. Further, it offers them the flexibility to redeem the requisite credits for the award of an appropriate Certificate / Diploma/ Degree, depending on the stage of their exit during the programme/course. This provision will give them an opportunity for lifelong learning, as well as help them avail academic outreach beyond the superstructure of the programme of study in another university/institution at the national/international level depending upon the student's choice. Motilal Nehru College as one of the constituent institutions of the University of Delhi has formally implemented the ABC scheme.
- (b) The institution, being a constituent institution of the

University of Delhi, has registered itself under the ABC, and has directed the students to do so on the ABC portal.

- (c) The institution being an affiliate of the University of Delhi is not authorized, without the University's approval, to collaborate with a foreign university for the purpose of offering a joint degree or enabling credit transfer.
- (d) The faculty members are allowed the freedom, and even encouraged, to adopt innovative yet rigorous pedagogical approaches to curriculum delivery and evaluation of students. Introduction of a wide range of courses with a significant component of practicals and increased weightage of continuous and internal assessment under the NEP-UGCF 2022 has enabled the teachers to use a combination of various methods (e.g., presentation, quiz, debate, viva voce, home assignment, group project, group discussion, in-class tests, field visit and report, etc.) for teaching and assessment for every paper.
- (e) The institution issued directions on 14/03/2023 (http://www.mlncdu.ac.in/pdf/notice140323.pdf) for the students to register themselves on the Academic Bank of Credits portal (www.abc.gov.in), while filling the examination form for semester II/IV/VI, and made the final verification of their forms subject to the completion of registration on the ABC portal.

- (a) Various departments of the institution offer discipline, elective, skill-enhancement and value-addition courses that foster informed awareness of, pride in and respect for Indian knowledge systems:
 - SEC: Yoga in Practice, offered by the departments of History and Sanskrit
 - VAC: Yoga: Philosophy & Practice, offered by the departments of History and Sanskrit
 - VAC: Ayurveda and Nutrition, offered by the departments of Chemistry and Physics
 - VAC: Panchakosha: Holistic Development of Personality, offered by the department of Sanskrit
 - VAC: Vedic Mathematics, offered by the departments of Mathematics and Sanskrit
 - The institution and its constituent departments organize lectures/seminars/conferences on IKS or aspects thereof from time to time.
 - (b) The faculty has the requisite experience and training to

teach the students bilingually (i.e. in English and Hindi), as well as evaluate their performance through written and oral submissions in a bilingual mode, since a large section of students are drawn from vernacular educational backgrounds. Besides, all efforts are taken to make study material, particularly in vernacular (Hindi), available to the students.

(c) The degree courses taught entirely in Indian languages are: B.A.(Hons) in Hindi and Sanskrit. All other courses are taught bilingually.

19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

The college has implemented the UGCF-2022 which is essentially an Outcome-based curriculum framework. All the courses therein have clearly spelt-out Learning Objectives and Learning Outcomes that apprise the students and teachers about what each course aims to teach and what the students expect to learn and do after studying it. The enunciation of objectives and outcomes of the courses provides a roadmap for the teachers and enables them to devise appropriate approaches to teaching and evaluation. The faculty-members of the college work towards helping the students attain the objectives and outcomes of their respective courses.

20.Distance education/online education:

The Covid-19-induced lockdowns in 2020-22 forced the faculty and the students to learn and use online modes of teaching, learning and evaluation. The institution also tried to organize faculty development programmes in the online mode in 2021-22. With the slow return to normalcy and staggered academic sessions in 2022-23, the institution provided for blended learning especially when the classes and examinations for different semesters coincided. Since the full-fledged opening of the University in 2023, with the parallel commencement of classes for all the years, the skills and IT tools learnt during the Covid period have considerably enhanced the efficacy of curriculum delivery by the faculty, the assessment of students' performance and the ease of communication among all stakeholders (i.e. administration, faculty, students). The technological tools have proved to be a powerful aid to the teaching-learning process in the physical mode, but not its replacement. These tools have also ensured that the teachinglearning process and teacher-learner communication can withstand any physical interruption or break, big or small.

The University of Delhi does not authorize the institution to introduce any full-fledged degree course in distance and/or online mode, which is the prerogative of the University's School of Open Learning. Nevertheless, the institution has conducted and plans to introduce more short- to medium-term skill-based or vocational courses.
